### Become a Certified TeacherCoach

Join the TeacherCoach team and generate additional income while expanding your talents. Coaches can supplement their income or become full time for a lifestyle change. Coaches typically make more money than teachers, have more freedom and flexibility in their time, and enjoy working for a supportive organization with stimulating peer interactions.

Coaches must spend at least six months in active practice following completion of the certificate program before applying to the next level. *Workshops*: Multiple days/times on a complex topic or multiple topics.

If you are a current or former educator, with a talent for working with colleagues, this may be for you. Coaches and trainers must be engaging, well organized, and have creative ideas on how to improve the personal and professional lives of others. If you fit this mold and are interested in advanced training to become a trainer.

## Level Explanations

**Level One:** Co-Facilitation only. Cannot create own training. Assists with conducting small and large group classes but may do private coaching. Earns income through private coaching at a rate of 30%. Earns 20% for seminars, trainings, and workshops. Three recommendations from a Level II, III, or IV trainer needed prior to application for advanced training.

**Level Two:** May be the lead for training, but must use a co-facilitator. Must use trainings that are already outlined in the current selection. Private coaching may also be done at a rate of 40% earnings. Earns 30% for seminars, trainings, and workshops. One recommendation from a Level III or IV Trainer prior to application for advanced training.

**Level Three:** May conduct training independently or with a co-facilitator. May create own trainings with approval from Director of Training. Earns 50% for coaching and trainings.

**Level Four:** May conduct training independently or with a co-facilitator. May create own trainings. May train other trainers. Level IV trainers make 60% of whatever they earn.
